1. As per paper read (1) above, the Syndicate resolved to conduct Certificate Programmes and Diploma Programmes under the Directorate of Physical Education, in collaboration with the Rural Art Hub (under the Directorate of Culture, Government of Kerala) through the Kerala Folklore Academy.
2. Subsequently, the Vice Chancellor as per paper read (2) above, ordered to commence the above mentioned Certificate Programmes and Diploma Programmes under School of Lifelong Learning of the University
3. Therefore, as per read (3) above Director, SLL was entrusted to draft a common Regulations for Diploma Programmes, offering through School of Lifelong Learning of the University
4. Subsequently, as per paper read (4) above, Director, School of Lifelong Learning submitted the drafts of common Regulations, for Diploma programmes and Certificate Programmes offered in Institutions approved by Kannur University through the Centre for Lifelong Learning under School of Lifelong Learning of the University
5. The Vice Chancellor, after considering the matter in detail, and in exercise of the powers of the Academic Council conferred under Section 11(1) of Chapter III of the Kannur University Act 1996, ***approved the Regulations of both Certificate Programmes and Diploma Programmes to be offered in Institutions approved by Kannur University through Centre for Lifelong Learning under School of Lifelong Learning, subject to reporting the matter to the Academic Council.***
6. The Regulations of 1) Certificate Programmes and 2) Diploma Programmes offering through Centre for Lifelong Learning under School of Lifelong Learning, is appended with this U.O. and uploaded in the website.
7. Orders are issued accordingly.

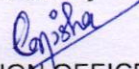

REGULATIONS FOR ONE-YEAR DIPLOMA PROGRAMME OFFERED IN INSTITUTIONS APPROVED BY KANNUR UNIVERSITY THROUGH CENTRE FOR LIFELONG LEARNING UNDER SCHOOL OF LIFELONG LEARNING

1. Title

These Regulations shall be called the "Regulations for One-Year Diploma Programme in the respective discipline offered in institutions approved by Kannur University through the Centre for Lifelong Learning (SLL) under School of Lifelong Learning of Kannur University."

2. Scope

- The Regulations provided herein shall apply to the One-Year Diploma Programme in respective disciplines offered in the Institutions approved by Kannur University through Centre for Lifelong Learning under School of Lifelong Learning (SLL) , from the year 2026 onwards.
- The Programme is designed for skill enhancement, employability and capacity building with structured academic framework comprising theory and practical components.
- Conduct of the programme shall be governed by a MoU executed between the Institutions conducting the programme and the University.

3. Duration of the Programme

The duration of the Programme shall be one year consisting of two semesters including Evaluation, with the course content approved by the Advisory Committee of Centre for Lifelong Learning.

4. Programme Structure

1. The Programme shall be conducted under the Credit and Semester System.
2. The Programme shall comprise courses carrying a total of **32 Credits** distributed over two semesters.
3. The minimum credits required for successful completion of the Programme shall be **32 Credits**.



4. The Board of Studies/Expert Committee concerned shall prescribe the courses, credits, contact hours, practicals, project work, internship, field work, or viva-voce, whichever applicable.
5. Medium of Instruction: English or Malayalam.

5. Admission

1. Admission to the Programme, through SLL, shall be made in accordance with the notification issued from time to time.
2. The minimum qualification for admission shall be pass in Plus Two or equivalent or as prescribed in the concerned Syllabus as per the requirement of the Programme concerned.

6. Fee Structure

The fee for the Programme and the portion of the fee to be shared with the institutions shall be decided by the Advisory Committee and approved by the Syndicate.

7. Attendance

1. A student shall secure not less than 75% attendance for the practical/ training sessions in each semester to become eligible to appear for the End Semester Evaluation(ESE).Attendance Progress Certificate shall be furnished by the institution prior to the commencement of ESE.

8. Evaluation

The evaluation shall consist of:

- 1. Continuous Evaluation (CE)**
- 2. End Semester Evaluation (ESE)**

The ratio of Continuous Evaluation to End Semester Examination shall be as prescribed in the concerned Syllabus as per the requirement of the Programme concerned.

Appearance in both CE and ESE is compulsory for the successful completion of the programme.

1. Continuous Evaluation (CE)

The Continuous Evaluation shall be based on one or more of the following:

- Test Papers
- Assignments
- Viva Voce/Seminar/ Case Study



- Practical Records
- Any other academic activity as prescribed in the concerned Syllabus as per the requirement of the Programme concerned.
- CE marks prepared by the concerned institutions shall be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations.

2. End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The procedure for the conduct of the End Semester Evaluation, from the issuance of the examination notification to the issuance of the Grade Card or certificate, shall be carried out by the Controller of Examinations.

9. Pass Requirements

A candidate shall be declared to have passed a course if he/she secures:

- A minimum of 40% marks in the End Semester Evaluation; and a minimum of 40% aggregate marks combining Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Evaluation.
- A candidate who passes all courses and secures the required 32 credits shall be declared eligible for the award of the Diploma in the discipline concerned.

10. Seven Point Grading System

The performance of students shall be evaluated using a Seven Point Grading System as follows:

Percentage of Marks	Grade
90 and above	A+ (Outstanding)
80 – Below 90	A (Excellent)
70 – Below 80	B (Very Good)
60 – Below 70	C (Good)
50 – Below 60	D (Satisfactory)
40 – Below 50	E (Pass)
Below 40	F (Failure)

11. Grade Point



- Evaluation (both CE-Continuous Evaluation and ESE – End Semester Evaluation) is carried out using the mark system. The grading on the basis of a total CE and ESE marks will be indicated for each course.
- Each letter grade is assigned a Grade Point (GP), which is a point given to a grade on the scale as prescribed under clause 10 above and is obtained using the formula:

$$\text{Grade Point (GP)} = (\text{Total Marks Awarded} / \text{Total Maximum Marks}) \times 10$$

12. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) shall be calculated as:

$$\text{SGPA} = \Sigma (\text{Credit} \times \text{Grade Point}) / \Sigma \text{Credits of the Semester}$$

13. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The overall performance of a student shall be indicated by the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

$$\text{CGPA} = \Sigma (\text{Credit} \times \text{Grade Point of all Courses}) / \text{Total Credits}$$

14. Classification of Results

The classification of successful candidates shall be based on CGPA as follows:

Percentage of Marks	Grade
90 and above	A+ (Outstanding)
80 – Below 90	A (Excellent)
70 – Below 80	B (Very Good)
60 – Below 70	C (Good)
50 – Below 60	D (Satisfactory)
40 – Below 50	E (Pass)
Below 40	F (Failure)

15. Improvement and Reappearance

- Candidates who fail in one or more courses may reappear for the End Semester Evaluation as per University rules.
- Improvement of marks in End Semester Evaluation shall be permitted in accordance with University rules prevailing from time to time.
- There shall be no revaluation/Improvement for Continuous Evaluation (CE).



16. Award of Diploma

A candidate who successfully completes the Programme by earning the prescribed 32 credits and fulfilling all other requirements stipulated as per clause 9 shall be awarded the Diploma in the respective discipline. The Controller of Examinations shall issue a Grade Card for the programme containing the title of the course, the credits earned, the grades awarded, and the GPA. Successful students shall also be awarded a certificate by the Controller of Examinations, indicating the name of the programme, its duration, and the grade obtained.
